Our new Regional Landcare Facilitators are part of this national network of skilled people that link, and support, community Landcare and production groups participating in sustainable farm and land management practices.

The team will work towards providing an interface between regional bodies, industry groups, Research & Development organisations and also provide feedback

to the Australian Government and National Landcare Facilitator Network on emerging issues and current attitudes and activities in the WA Rangelands NRM region.

A major role of the Landcare Facilitators is to promote opportunities for groups and networks to access public and private funds to address public benefit sustainable farm and land management practices.

# Rangelands Projects



## Roebuck Bay Working Group

Roebuck Bay Working Group (RBWG) was established in 2004 with the objective of "developing a value based community drive planning process to protect, restore and maintain the catchment into the future." Originally auspiced by the Kimberley Land Council (then Yawuru from 2011), the RBWG is a not-for-profit community group who works with landholders, non-government organisations, industry, Federal, State and Local Governments and community groups.

Rangelands NRM has provided funding to the RBWG to work on the project "Roebuck Bay community engagement and protection of Ramsar values".

The aim of the project is to increase community understanding, participation and stewardship in the management of Roebuck Bay and the



Ramsar site by:

- Facilitating volunteer engagement in RBWG and on-ground projects that protect, restore or maintain the natural and cultural values of the Ramsar site.
- Identify and prioritise priority on-ground NRM projects which address Ramsar threats and are consistent with Rangelands and Caring for Our Country objectives.

## Funding News

### Community Grants

Community grants are a component of the State NRM Program, and provide funding for community based projects that target on-ground natural resource management action at a local level.

The State Government has allocated \$3 million for the community grants, with eligible groups able to apply for grants of between \$10,000 and \$50,000. Applications must be received by **COB, Friday 7 January 2011**.

### Coastwest Grants Program

Coastwest grants are for projects designed to improve the condition and amenity of the coastal zone in Western Australia. The grants provide opportunities and resources for on-ground coastal management activities and to facilitate community involvement and capacity-building.

The Coastwest Grants Program is expected to open in **February 2011**.

### Coastwest Community Support Grants

The purpose of the Community Support Grant is to encourage groups to become involved in coastal and marine management for the first time and to maintain the momentum of community groups who have completed a project but are yet to receive another grant.

It is a **rolling grants program** enabling groups to apply for funding at any time. Up to \$3,000 per annum is available with proponents having to provide \$1 in financial or in-kind support for each \$1 of the Coastwest funds requested.

### Coastwest Regional Coastal Management Group Support Fund

Regional coastal management groups play an important role as a peak body addressing and prioritising coastal and marine planning and management issues at a regional level in Western Australia. These groups also foster and maintain direct links to smaller coastal management groups in the region. The fund is aimed at providing financial support for administration and capacity building of these groups; up to \$8,000 is available (with conditions).

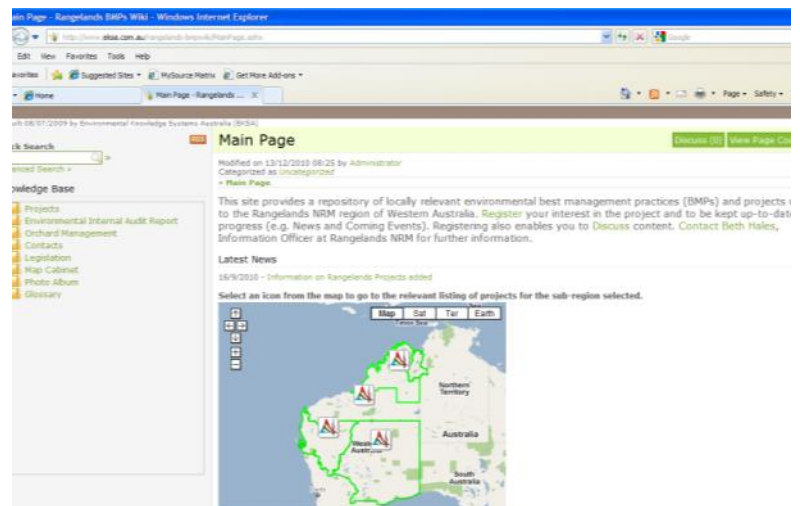
### Project Website:
